Here are the top locations for retirement around the world, as reported by <u>MarketWatch</u>, and based on the Natixis Global Retirement Index.

The Natixis Global Retirement Index ranks retirement security in 150 countries. MarketWatch explains: "The study, tapping data from the World Bank, World Health Organization and elsewhere, ranks countries on criteria such as access to health care, life expectancy, unemployment, income equality, tax burden, savings yields, investment environment, the country's overall financial stability, and quality of life, including whether the country provides "a clean, safe environment in which to live," according to the report." Natixis reports that, "For the third consecutive year, the U.S. placed 19th among the 150 nations on the list, as benefits of the U.S. economic recovery offset growing demand on government finances. France was 18th, with the U.K. placing 22nd."
